



## Age-Adjusted Prevalence of Acute Myocardial Infarctions (Ages 18+) is Higher in Riverside County than State Average





## EPA Estimated Mortality in Riverside County due to Highway Vehicle Pollution


Cause	Estimated Annual Deaths
Mortality, short-term exposure to ozone	1.5
Mortality, long-term exposure to ozone	33
Mortality, all exposure to PM 2.5	15-33
Infant Mortality, all exposure to PM 2.5	0.14*
