MEETING MINUTES FOR January 15, 12:00 pm to 1:30 pm

- I. **OPENING REMARKS / CALL TO ORDER**: Mr. Chairperson, Greg Damewood called the Criminal Justice Committee (CJC) meeting to order at 12:00pm.
- II. **MINUTES REVIEW**: November 13, 2024, meeting minutes were reviewed and approved.

IV. PRIOR BUSINESS

• STATE HOSPITAL UPDATE:

- o 22 people in the State Hospital.
- 36 people in the jail-based competency treatment (JBCT) program.
- 1 person in the EASS Program.

• HHOPE UPDATE

• No update from HHOPE.

• COLLABORATIVE COURT REPORT UPDATES:

- Combined referrals from Temecula, Riverside, and Indio: 42.
- 12 accepted mental health diversions.
- 89 new referrals; 59 accepted for Veterans Treatment Corps and Military Diversion programs.
- 34 new referrals; 22 new participants entered the program.
- *Received* a \$2,000,000 SAMHSA grant over five years (\$400,000 annually).

> Rock Adult Drug Court:

- 31 new referrals over the past two months.
- Blythe: 0 new referrals.
- Indio: 2 new referrals.
- Riverside: 22 new referrals.
- Southwest: 7 new referrals.

> Referrals accepted:

- o Southwest: 3
- Riverside: 7
- o Indio: 2
- Blythe: 1 pending, likely from a prior case.

• CARE COURT UPDATES

- 20 petitions, 18 referrals, and 15 marked as "other" (details pending).
- 10 new referrals for AOT; 9 new IST referrals; 9 new Home Court referrals.
- Data across four courts: Indio, Banning, Riverside, and Temecula.

• STAFFING UPDATES:

- Indio Jail: 100% capacity
- Blyth Jail: Not at full capacity
- Southwest: 87% capacity
- o Banning Jail: 74% capacity
- Riverside Jail: 91% capacity
- DCU: 100% capacity
 - Overall staffing for the program: 90%

• New Life and Justice Outreach

- Referrals: As of mid-July, we've received 150 out-of-custody referrals.
- 75-80% have been assessed.
- Roughly 90% of clients are staying with New Life (primary assessing team for mental health diversion).
- **Caseload**: Our caseloads have doubled since mid-July.
- **New Staff**: A new drug and alcohol counselor has been assigned to the mental health diversion program.
- Consumer Data Over 4,000 consumers served from July 1st to September (data collected).
- **ICANN Assessment**: The assessment evaluates 23 outcomes, with 10 core outcomes highlighted in the report.
- Every 90 days, updates are made in collaboration with the consumer and treatment team.
- Outcomes: **51%** improvement in most areas, with many reaching **70%**.
