The Youth Hospital Intervention Program utilizes a team approach to serve children at risk for psychiatric hospitalization.

We strive to provide compassionate, quality care to children and families to support

children remaining in their homes.



COMMUNITY BASED RESPONSE TEAMS

Behavioral health services are offered in the community and the three Youth Hospital Intervention Program locations. These services include conducting Risk Assessment, Clinical Assessment, developing Treatment Plan goals, provision of Short-term Therapy, Skills Building and Case Management, referral for Therapeutic Behavioral Services, Parent Education, psychiatry & medication evaluation, and linkage to ongoing behavioral health services.

SPECIALIZED SERVICES INCLUDE:

Individual and family therapy using programs supported by research to be effective.

Multidisciplinary team members include Marriage and Family Therapists, Clinical Social Workers, Behavioral Specialists, Parent Partners, and Peer Partners. Team members partner with family members to establish treatment goals and to create the road map for achieving these goals.

COLLABORATION WITH COMMUNITY RESOURCES & SCHOOLS TO PROVIDE TEAM SCHOOL BASED SUPPORT SERVICES

The Youth Hospital Intervention Program teams have established relationships with local schools to support students in crisis.

The Youth Hospital Intervention Program teams will work with children and families to divert inpatient hospitalization whenever possible by providing individualized services designed to support them during a crisis.
