



Land Acknowledgment

The Riverside University Health System – Public Health, Health Equity program acknowledges the traditional, ancestral, and contemporary homelands of the Indigenous Peoples of Riverside County whose land we occupy. The Iviatem (Cahuilla), Payómkawichum (Luiseño), Maara'yam (Serrano), Nuwuvi (Chemehuevi), and Tongva (Gabrieleño) peoples have been the caretakers of this land, water, and air since time immemorial.

Indigenous Peoples have been forcefully displaced or relocated and colonization is ongoing with their lands still occupied due to the dishonest illusion of promised treaties. The Health Equity program commits to practicing cultural humility and reciprocity, respecting, and supporting the tribal sovereignty, culture, and beliefs of Indigenous Peoples of Riverside County and beyond.

We hope to build an honest, ongoing relationship with Indigenous Peoples in Riverside County as we learn from their vast experiences. We recognize that there have been past injustices and aim to move toward reconciliation with good intentions and respect. We challenge you to join us in this work. If you are unaware of whose land you are currently occupying, we encourage you to learn about the Indigenous Peoples in your area, their history and ongoing resilience.


- Visited and recorded polluting land uses in the ECV to make them visible to our community through the PSA

APCTC HISTORY AND PROGRAMS

- Established in 1977 as a LA County Dept Mental Health program
- First MH center in LA County to address growing population of Asian Pacific immigrants and refugees in need of services
- APCTC became its own non-profit entity in 1990 under the guidance of Special Services for Groups, Inc. (SSG)
- APCTC has locations throughout SoCal

Los Angeles | Alhambra | Van Nuys | Cerritos | Riverside

- Services are provided for adults, children, and youth with cultural sensitivity and bilingual capacity (including Vietnamese, Thai, Chinese (Cantonese and Mandarin), Japanese, Korean, Tagalog, Laotian, Thai and Spanish
- Programs include mental health counseling, case management, community education and workshops



CDC RUHS COVID-19 CHW GRANT


- In 2021, CDC released funding for a National Initiative to Address COVID-19 Health Disparities Among Populations at High-Risk and Underserved
- RUHS identified a strong need, but limited availability, to outreach and engage the diverse AAPI communities during the pandemic
- Working with partner API subcontractor organizations representing major demographic groups in the county



















WHAT WE KNOW ABOUT COVID-19 OMICRON VARIANT

The virus that causes COVID-19 is constantly changing, and new variants of the virus, like Omicron, are expected to occur.

Spread

Omicron will spread more easily than the original SARS-CoV-2. It is expected that anyone with Omicron infection can spread the virus to others. even if they are vaccinated or don't have

Severe Illness

More data are needed to know if infections. especially reinfections and breakthrough infections in vaccinated people, cause more severe illness or death than infection with other variants.

Vaccines

Current vaccines are expected to protect against severe illness, hospitalizations, and deaths. However, breakthrough infections in people who are fully vaccinated are likely to occur.

Wear a Mask

IMPACT

- Trained all CHWs on administering surveys and collected over 500 surveys from community members
- UC Riverside developed geospatial maps of AANHPI communities in Riverside County, including information on critical health indicators (eg. income, poverty, households with disabilities) which help further the county's understanding of disparities in this population
- Almost 1400 instances of COVID-19 health and mental health outreach and linkages to services for COVID-19 positive individuals



CDSS STOP THE HATE PROGRAM

- Partnership with PVFAA for STH services in Riverside County
- Provide mental health and navigation services to assist individuals and families impacted by hate crimes / incidents
- Provide cultural / arts programs and youth leadership workshops to increase skills and understanding of fostering relationships across cultural groups
- Design a curriculum for all community members and conduct trainings to educate about elements of hate crimes / incidents, services for victims of hate, and related topics



API VELOCity

The VELOCity Project (Voices Educating the Local City) aims to empower
Asian Pacific Islander (API) high school student leaders to improve mental
health literacy among API youth and families by expanding knowledge and
ability to access mental health prevention, treatment, and wellness
resources in the community.

• Educational mental health workshops facilitated by our Community Mental Health Promoters, which include topics like MH 101, anxiety, depression, substance use, and suicide prevention

Preparedness, Vaccines, and Your Call to Action

- Multiple layers of strategy maximize health and well being during respiratory virus season
- Self assess your risk:
 - Work
 - School
 - Home
 - Caregiving
 - Community
- Populations at increased risk:
 - Healthcare workers, those who live in congregate settings, people ages 6 to 23 months, people ages 65 and older
 - Those who may have a compromised immune system



West Coast Health Alliance

- CDPH Protects Vaccine Access in Concurrence with the West Coast Health Alliance


California COVID-19 Dashboard

The Respiratory Virus dashboard currently only shows COVID-19 data. Flu and RSV data will be added in the Fall season. For historical Flu and RSV data, see Previous Respiratory Virus Reports below.

This dashboard shows statewide and regional weekly data for COVID-19. This dashboard is a quick look at COVID-19 activity and severity for each week of surveillance and updates most Fridays. The data are reported early and may change in future updates as more information becomes available.

What to Know Now

COVID-19 activity is now slowing across CA. As we enter the fall respiratory virus season, it remains important to take steps to protect yourself and those around you from severe illness.

Your Call to Action

- Self assess your own risk and stay curious
 - Assess Your family and community risk
 - Engage with data/trends in your community (<u>Riverside County Respiratory Virus Dashboard</u>)



- Prepare ahead of time:
 - Supplies (hand sanitizers, hand soap, masks, tests, fever reducing medications), cleaning products, Space (identify the spaces used when people are sick)
- Identify your strategy for support and personal well being
 - Who helps me / family when there is illness? Intentional sleep hygiene and nutrition




