


Majority of 105°F+ Days in Riverside County Occur in Coachella Valley and Eastern Regions



This graph shows the number of days recorded over the previous five years that the temperature reached a specific maximum level. Daily maximum temperatures were recorded at airports in each of the five county regions: Blythe Airport (East), Corona Municipal Airport (Southwest), March Air Reserve Base (Mid), Palm Springs International Airport (Coachella Valley), and Riverside Municipal Airport (Northwest).

Reports of E. Coli Infections are Increasing with a Recent Rise in Severe Complications



The number of Shiga Toxin-producing E. coli (STEC) infections in Riverside County have increased over recent years, mirroring trends across California. This increase has been attributed to environmental contamination of particular foods as well as increases in advanced testing.


American Indian and Alaska Native People are at Least Twice as Likely to Die from Chronic Liver Disease as Any Other Racial or Ethnic Group



Age-Adjusted Mortality Rates for Chronic Liver Disease by Race / Ethnicity (2019-2023)




