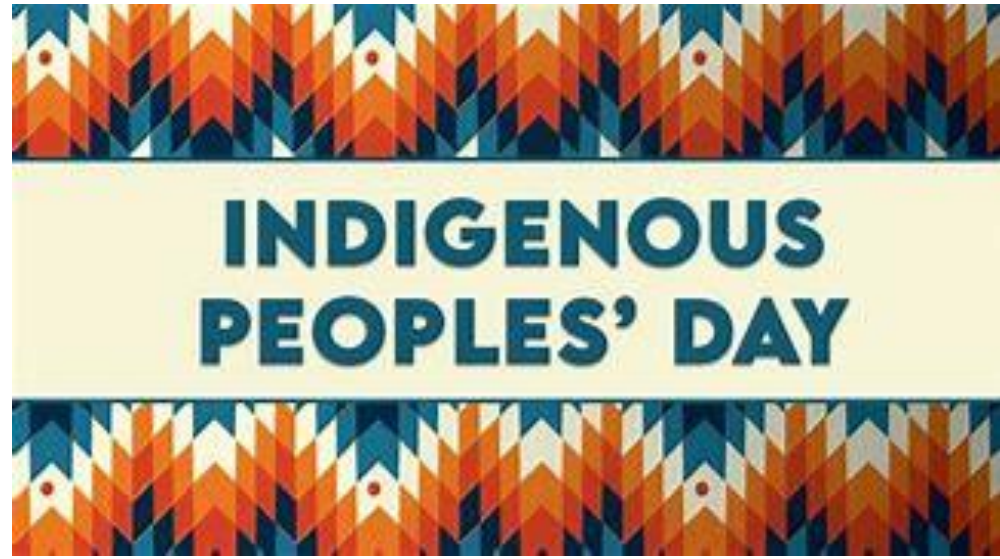

Presentation: Native American History and Health

Dr. Trafzer is a distinguished professor of History and Costo Chair in American Indian Affairs at University of California, Riverside.

He is of mixed Wyandot descent and for the past 50 years, his research has focused on Native American History.

His most recent books focus on Indian Health among Southern California's Indigenous peoples, including *Fighting Invisible Enemies: Health and Medical Transitions Among Southern California Indians* (University of Oklahoma Press, 2019), *Strong Hearts and Healing Hands: Southern California Indians and Field Nurses, 1920-1950* (University of Arizona Press, 2021), and *Willie Boy & the Last Western Manhunt* (Coyote Hill Press, Amazon, 2020).

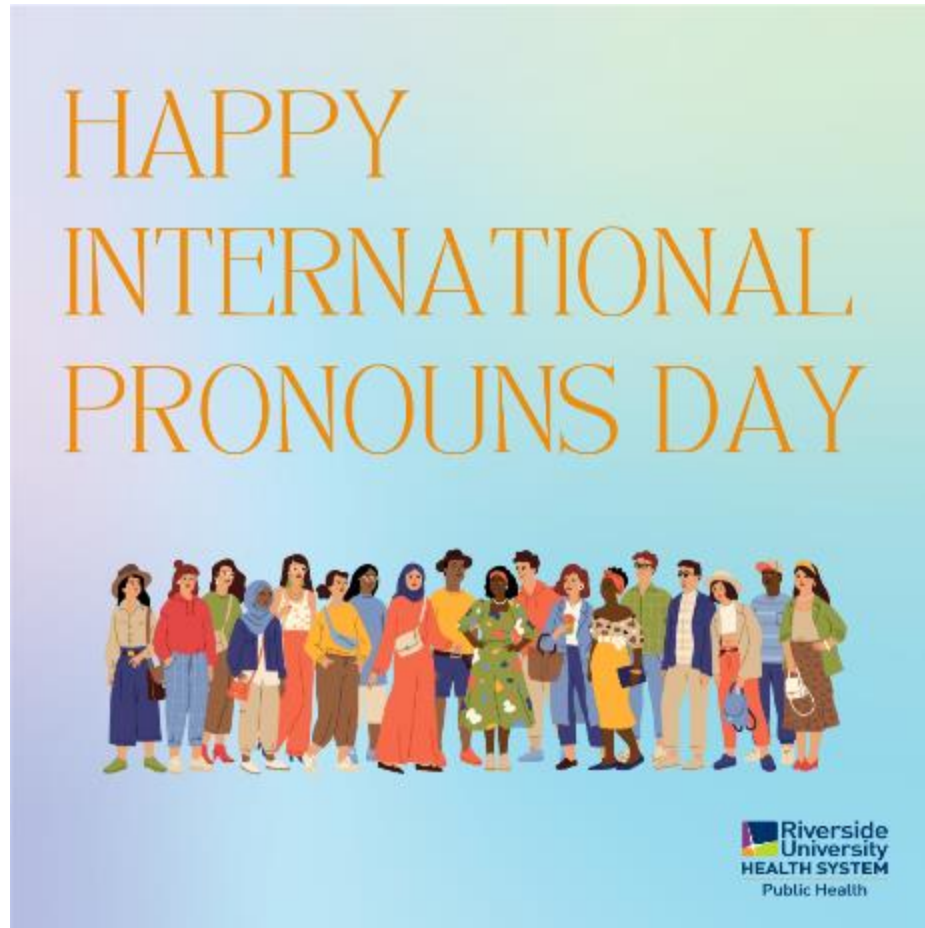


