Satisfaction



- **86.4%** gained a good amount to a great deal of knowledge.
- **78.3%** felt that the content was applicable to very applicable.
- **All respondents** indicated some level of satisfaction for the opportunity for engagement, quality of the presentations, and overall experience. No one provided neutral or negative ratings for those three individual components.



Priority Areas

Housing

95.4% agreed with area

(1 disagreed but provided no rationale. Five skipped the question)

Workgroup Starting Points

- 1) Affordable housing: **45% (9)**
- 2) Homelessness: **30% (6)**
- 3) More housing options for remote/disadvantaged areas: **10% (2)**
- 4) Other*: **10% (2)**
- 5) Loan or financial assistance: **5% (1)**

**Other options included housing subsidies (1) and all of the above: Gathering and assessing data for top priority items to dive into first (1).*

Mental Health/Suicide Prevention

100% agreed with area

(5 skipped the question)

Workgroup Starting Points

- 1) Providing outreach/resources: **42.9% (9)**
- 2) Vulnerable populations: **28.6% (6)**
- 3) Other*: **14.3% (3)**
- 4) Training: **9.5% (2)**
- 5) Cost of mental health services: **4.8% (1)**

**Other options included psychology seasons [sic] (1), all of the above and also engaging the community in the process (1), guns and radicalization of vulnerable people by social media and disinformation (1).*



Future Topics

- Mental Health ($n=3$)
- Culture ($n=2$) in terms of providing resources and for health equity purposes.
- Other individual topics were: sexual and reproductive health, wealth creation, caregiver resources, the COVID-19 pandemic, creating health fairs, arts and health initiatives, public art and public health integration, and identifying stakeholders to lead and help collaborate.
- Eight individuals expressed interest in presenting at a future RCHC meeting.

Recommendations

- Continue to encourage survey completion particularly to virtual participants. Share both the QR code and survey link to virtual attendees.
- Reframe organizational question so that county employees select the area associated with their department.

Additional Comments

- Three individuals gave praise with one specifying that it is a great way to get the community and partners together.
- The City of Perris is interested in hosting a future RCHC meeting.
- Someone specified that a different translator is needed.
