"Very Satisfied".



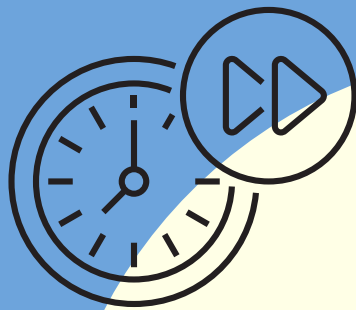
Overall Experience
