

RISE Care Partner Study

Do you identify as Black or African American and support a person living with dementia?

Researchers at the University of Michigan are recruiting Black care partners (family members or friends who support a person living with dementia) and people living with dementia to learn more about their daily lives and sleep patterns.



Care partners receive up to \$145 and people living with dementia receive up to \$52 for participating.

Who can participate?

- Care partners who live with and support a person living with dementia, identifying as Black or African American, and reside in the United States
- People living with symptoms of dementia (with or without a diagnosis of dementia)

What is involved?

- Care partners: one 60-minute phone interview, 21 days of smartphone surveys, and one 20- to 30-minute follow-up phone interview
- People living with dementia: one 15- to 20-minute phone interview
- Both care partners and people living with dementia wear a wrist activity monitor (similar to a watch) for 21 days
